Are you organising a CyberCleanUp in your company? Here's a practical checklist:

Why is my company organising a Cyber CleanUp?	<ul> <li>□ To strengthen its CSR approach</li> <li>□ To raise employee awareness</li> <li>□ To improve its processes and gain in efficiency</li> <li>□ To reduce storage costs and extend the life of IT equipment</li> </ul>
What exactly do we clean?	<ul> <li>□ The scope of the Cyber Clean Up should be defined according to its relevance to the business, ability to do etc:</li> <li>□ Company servers</li> <li>□ Cloud services</li> <li>□ Email boxes</li> <li>□ Business phones</li> <li>□ Business social networks</li> </ul>
Who should be involved?	<ul> <li>Notify the IT Manager of the framework in which the process is taking place</li> <li>Notify the Data Protection Officer</li> <li>Mobilise the managers</li> <li>Adress all employees concerned by the chosen scope</li> <li>Ask support from the communication department</li> <li>Inform partners and clients of the initiative</li> <li>In case of questions, contact the Cyber World CleanUp Day team at contact@cyberworldcleanupday.fr</li> </ul>
Where can it be organised?	<ul> <li>Within the company</li> <li>Each at their own workstation</li> <li>Together in a meeting room, in compliance with the sanitary instructions in force. (Think about the logistics and the necessary plugs if applicable)</li> <li>Remotely by teleworking</li> </ul>
When are the actions to be taken?	<ul> <li>□ Before March 14th</li> <li>□ Register my company's Cyber CleanUp on www.cyberworldcleanupday.fr</li> </ul>





	Used Editivities (2)
	<ul> <li>Organise a scoping meeting for the event with the IT department, the communication department and managers if applicable</li> <li>Define the scope of the CleanUp</li> <li>Communicate internally</li> <li>Mobilise partners</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>During the week of 14-20 March 2022</li> <li>Measure the volume of data before the operation according to the defined strategy</li> <li>The company mobilizes and deletes its data in the chosen perimeter on defined time slots or at the free choice of each</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>□ After the 20th of March</li> <li>□ Measure the impact and communicate it to the Cyber World CleanUp Day project team</li> </ul>
How much data is cleaned?	Measure its data before and after the operation to know the volume cleaned.
How can this be done in practice?	<ul> <li>Use the resources available at <a href="www.cyberworldcleanupday.fr">www.cyberworldcleanupday.fr</a></li> <li>The guides for cleaning up according to the chosen perimeter (for inspiration or to be made available to participants where appropriate) and measuring data before and after the CleanUp.</li> <li>The standard powerpoint presentation for the kick-off meeting</li> <li>Awareness raising resources</li> <li>The official logo to put on my various internal or external communication materials about the event.</li> <li>To note its measures on the dedicated Excel sheet</li> <li>Go further by producing a charter of good practice for the future and reviewing processes.</li> </ul>
